### **Dear Friends,**

As our team and I have been adamantly pressing towards the goal to launch our men's recovery program, I wanted to take a quick pause to share an update on all our progress and what we have achieved since my inception as the Executive Director in the winter of 2020. Of course, starting from ground zero at the start of 2021, our first initiative was to establish our Board of Directors, whose names I am very proud to highlight in this update!

Secondly, we hired a graphic designer who helped solidify our messaging and branding to be able to launch our marketing campaign. As a part of our marketing campaign, we launched our organization's website, social media outlets and created informational brochures for the public. In addition, we established our business phone line and contact donor management system.

At the commencement of our marketing campaign, we launched our awareness campaign for the Green Bay and Appleton communities. First, our awareness campaign educated the two about Northeast Wisconsin's alarming addiction mortality rates over the past seven years outlined later in this update. Secondly, we educated the community about Adult & Teen Challenges' national program 78% success rate as a practical solution for the substance abuse epidemic we are experiencing. Lastly, we presented a strong case for a need to have a men's and eventually women's faith-based residential drug and alcohol program option in Northeast Wisconsin.

Finally, our last and continued initiative was to establish as many strategic and donor partnerships as possible to help support and sustain our launching efforts. All in all, I am happy to report God has been incredibly faithful to give us great success in all these initiatives in 2021.

At the start of 2022, our primary focus has been to identify the right property for our men's residential program. Once we determine the location, we will officially launch our capital campaign, begin the staff hiring process and start preparations for our grand opening. We have remained open to land opportunities to build new, but our primary focus is on finding a residential or commercial property that fits our specific program facility needs. I am excited to share that we recently came into a residential opportunity in February in the Green Bay area with a high potential of being the right fit! Currently, we are in discussions regarding zoning approval from the city. I kindly request your ongoing prayers as we adamantly pursue finding the right location for our men's program.

Lastly, I want to sincerely thank all our partners and supporters who have come alongside and continue to stand with us to ensure our mission does not waiver—to help provide a program that will truly set people free from addiction. Because of you, we will become a lamp in the darkness and a light of hope to the hopeless!








#### THE MAJOR ATC-NEW EVENT
